Our first session will look at **income distribution and economic organization** and pose these questions: What do we know about income inequality and wealth distribution? How important is poverty, and what are we doing about it? How should we address the issue of income mobility in

America? Next we'll discuss how we organize our economy and define what we mean by the terms "capitalism," "socialism," and "mixed economy." We'll also consider the strengths and weaknesses of private enterprise vs. state-managed enterprises as well as the economic dimensions of "social justice."

In our second session we'll outline the principles of **government finance**. We'll discuss what state and federal budgets do and how they are paid for, as well as what determines the size of the annual budget deficit. We'll examine how fiscal policy influences economic growth and stability.

The third session will analyze other elements of our financial system: **money**, **banking**, **and monetary policy**. Issues addressed will include means of payment, savings vehicles, and credit; the Federal Reserve system; the banking system; and changing monetary theory and policy.


