David Bisno, M.D., a retired ophthalmologist with degrees from Harvard, Dartmouth, and the Washington University School of Medicine, has been an enthusiastic discussion leader on a myriad of topics for 28 years within institutes for lifelong learning across our country and overseas. With his wife, Fay, he was one of the founders of VISTAS in 1999 and has kept our attention with one topic after another ever since. In 2019 he asked us: *Is This How Fascism Comes to America*?

Having studied constitutional law at the Harvard Law School with Laurence Tribe and in Williamsburg at the Law School of the College of William and Mary, David has honed his abilities to make clear to all of us in an entertaining manner the

subtle nuances and competing interests inherent in constitutional law. Applying "strict scrutiny," we will come to appreciate why we have a "compelling interest" in the interpretation of "those wise restraints which make men free."
