This is our fourth series of “Heroes and Rogues” —our look at interesting characters who have influenced history, for good or ill. Not surprisingly, none of these diverse individuals have been either absolutely perfect or perfectly awful. Like us, they embody some good points as well as some not-so-good ones. But they all have unusual stories to tell. Join us for a new series and meet four more unique characters!

April 18 —Gerry Corrigan. **WILLIAM MULHOLLAND and the LA Aqueduct: A Story of Greed and Intrigue, of Lies and Deceits, of Water Wars and Chinatown.** The focus will be on the immigrant who was primarily responsible for bringing water to Los Angeles from the Owens Valley in 1913.



April 25 —Ted Anagnoson. **PHILBY and ANGLETON: A Tale of Two Spies.** This program is a study of two high-ranking international spies—Kim Philby for the UK and James Jesus Angleton for the U.S. They were for a time good friends, and both were intimately involved in establishing the CIA. However, Philby turned out to be a Soviet spy, while Angleton was obsessed with finding a high-ranking mole in the CIA.



May 2 —Laurie Guitteau. **ELEANOR OF AQUITAINE: The 12th Century Queen of Both France and England and a Forerunner of Feminism.** Eleanor was a skilled politician and a patron of the arts as well as mother of two kings of England. Her direct influence spanned a century, two crusades, and three kingdoms. Betrayal, deceit, scandals, power, notoriety, beauty, misogyny—the life of Eleanor of Aquitaine is better than a soap opera!

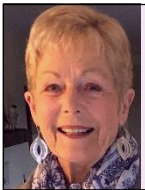
