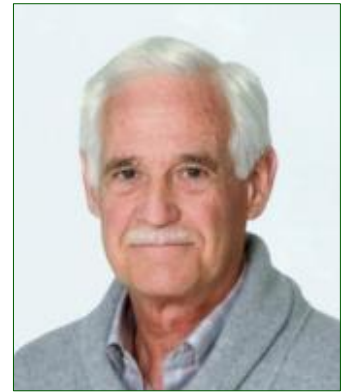

His business experience includes banking, international travel management, and real estate development. He created the finance program and the International Business program at SBCC in 1987 and 1995.

His publications include papers on macroeconomics in Namibia, tax policy, international energy markets, and financial development. His awards include Fulbright, Carnegie Foundation, and Brookings Institution fellowships. In 2018 he published the book *Methods and Observations of a Practical Economist*, integrating business, finance, and economics.
